Message from Our Executive Director and Board Chair

Thank you inspired daily actors!

Amidst the worst drought on record in California, our cup runneth over with gratitude for you. With your support, in 2015 we saved more water (2.4 million gallons) through drought-busting lawn transformations in six months than in six years of leading lawn transformations. And this is only a portion of the 115 educational programs and action campaigns we organized in 2015!

Daily Acts was founded on the belief that by reclaiming the power of our daily actions we can create richer lives and a better world. Because of you, we are doing JUST this. From empowered youth, citizens, and businesses to transformed landscapes; everything we achieve comes through community and collaboration. Community is in fact the soil in which Daily Acts propagates sustainability, and sustainability is the core issue of our time.

In 2015 Daily Acts co-led a collaboration that resulted in 30 lawn transformations in 30 days. The young people doing the transforming, some of whom had been homeless and grew up in poverty, went from a focus on surviving to feeling part of a movement. That is nothing short of a miracle. You can read more about this amazing collaboration on page 9. **Transforming a lawn can do more than save water. It can grow soil, food, medicine, and habitat. It can sow justice, sequester carbon, and strengthen the local economy; building richness and resilience in our lives, landscapes, and communities.**

In addition to record drought, our climate crisis has made the need for more sustainable, resilient households and communities urgently clear. People need inspiring and practical solutions, and to feel a part of something larger. The Community Resilience Challenge is that something larger. It amplifies our shared efforts, spreading sustainability solutions through neighborhoods, cities, and a rapidly growing movement for resilient communities.

The truth is, there has never been a time when our actions (and the ripples that they create!) have mattered more. Thank you for all that you do to reclaim the power of your daily actions and to support ours.



Project Profile: Mulchstock - The Largest Peaceful Lawn Transformation on Record

A group of volunteers is participating in a mulch stock project. They are pushing wheelbarrows and spreading mulch on a lawn. The scene is outdoors, with trees and a building in the background. The volunteers are wearing various clothing, including hats and t-shirts. The ground is covered in mulch, and there are some signs and markers on the lawn. The overall atmosphere is one of community service and environmental care.

In October, Daily Acts co-hosted Mulchstock, the largest community-powered sheet mulching project on record (an astonishing 64,000 square feet!). 135 volunteers transformed a massive, unused business park lawn into a drought-proof, mulched landscape which will save 1.6 million gallons of water annually (equivalent to 2.4 Olympic swimming pools). Participants enjoyed free massages, catered meals, and the musical musings of Sol Horizon, The Bad Apple String Band, and Grand Crue.

A pioneering example of collaboration between the business, municipal, and nonprofit sectors, Mulchstock organizing partners included Daily Acts, Clear Blue Commercial, Cagwin & Dorward, the City of Petaluma, and graduates of the Leadership Institute for Ecology and the Economy. The project was also supported by the Sonoma County Water Agency, Sonoma County Green Business Program, and ten business sponsors.


This landmark project was recognized with an award from 10th District Assembly Member, Marc Levine for “protecting the environment and precious water resources”.

Project Profile: Stronger Together Collaboration for Youth At-Risk

Stronger Together was a collaboration with eight local organizations and the Petaluma Community Foundation to support young people to thrive. Through this effort, Daily Acts partnered with Mentor Me to host a delightful (and ultimately delicious!) 4-part workshop series for youth and their mentors at the Cavanagh Center. Using the on-site community food forest established by Daily Acts and the City of Petaluma in 2009 as the classroom, participants filled veggie beds, made pressed flower luminaries, picked tomatoes for home-made pizzas, and harvested veggies for pickling. The success of this series launched an ongoing collaboration between Daily Acts and Mentor Me to empower and nourish mentors, mentees, and neighbors alike.

The Cavanagh Center food forest serves as a beacon and model for ecological gardening; providing ongoing community education and engagement opportunities, food, medicine, habitat, and wonder. Many of the surrounding residential landscapes have been transformed over the years by neighbors to include edibles, pollinators, medicinal, and native species, as well as rainwater catchment, greywater systems, and inspiration galore.

Project Profile: Community Resilience Challenge



2015 marked the 6th year of the Community Resilience Challenge, our annual action campaign that mobilizes people to save water, grow food, conserve energy, reduce waste, and build community. The Challenge amplifies individual action, helping spread sustainability solutions through neighborhoods, cities, and a rapidly growing movement for resilient communities. It inspires us with tangible evidence that many hands and hearts aligned in thoughtful action REALLY do add up to create a better world.

The 2015 Challenge was an outstanding success, with over 2,300 people participating locally in the campaign, registering a whopping 8,363 sustainability actions and projects! And that's just Sonoma County. Regional and national partners registered more than double this number.

Since the Challenge began in 2010, 22,949 actions and projects have been registered in Sonoma County and a further 59,920 have been registered through regional and national replication partners!

Project Profile: Youth Ecology Corps

California's drought emergency created the perfect opportunity to innovate, collaborate, and grow our impact. Through a collaboration between the Sonoma County Water Agency, Sonoma County Youth Ecology Corps, and Conservation Corps North Bay (CCNB) we piloted an ambitious program to replace 30 lawns in 30 days in the cities of Rohnert Park and Cotati.

Within days of approval, this wildly successful program launched and provided crew members with hands-on job training, valuable insight into sustainability practices, and a potential career pathway. In addition to the 30 lawns, three new inspiring model landscapes were installed at St. Elizabeth Seton Catholic Church, Sonoma Mountain Village, and Cotati City Hall resulting in a combined water savings of over 724,000 gallons per year.

Organizations and agencies rapidly responding to emergency, 30 lawns gone, lots of water saved, new model gardens, **AND the young people doing the transforming, some of whom had been homeless and grew up in poverty, went from a focus on surviving to feeling part of a movement.** That is nothing short of a miracle.
